# **COPD** care bundles: Improving implementation





Improving implementation of Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) discharge care bundles at Royal Cornwall Hospitals NHS Trust (RCHT) to ensure patients have the right care when they leave hospital.

### **Focus**

- The South West Patient Safety
  Collaborative (PSC), hosted by the South
  West AHSN, has been working with RCHT since
  2019 to support COPD and asthma discharge care
  bundle implementation in the region.
- Implementing discharge care bundles for people with COPD results in fewer readmissions to hospital<sup>[1]</sup> with associated reduction in costs and implications for improved patient outcomes.
- A COPD discharge care bundle includes: **follow-up care**, checking **inhaler technique**, referral for help to **stop smoking**, assessment and referral for **pulmonary rehabilitation**, emergency **drug packs** and a **self-management plan**.

## Approach

#### The South West PSC provided:



**Bespoke** quality improvement support




**'Pump-prime' funding** to recruit an audit facilitator to support completion of the National Asthma and COPD Audit Programme (NACAP)



**Facilitated networking** across organisational boundaries within Cornwall and the wider South West region.

A respiratory specialist nurse from RCHT attended South West PSC-led COPD and asthma learning events and webinars.

## **Impact**



more people have had appropriate follow-up care arranged on discharge

51% more people had their inhaler technique checked

51% more people have been referred for help to stop smoking

more people have been assessed for pulmonary rehabilitation

42% more people have recieved emergency drug packs

34% more people have recieved a self-management plan

#### What next?

RCHT continues to engage in ongoing improvement work as a member of the Kernow Respiratory Oversight Group and Southwest Respiratory Network. The South West AHSN is working on other national programmes to improve access to Fractional Exhaled Nitric Oxide (FeNO) testing and asthma biologics.
